George was part of the "Greatest Generation", a First Lieutenant for 32nd Armored Regiment and served as a Tank Commander of the 3rd Armored Division in World War II from 1942- 1946. He fought in The Battle of the Bulge and was only survivor of a direct hit to his tank. He received the Belgian Fourraguerre Medal, Campaign Medal, the European African Middle Eastern with four battle stars, the Bronze Star Medal, the Purple Heart with One Oak Leaf Cluster, World War II Victory Medal. He attended Officers Candidate School at Fort Knox, KY and he was recalled in 1951 serving as a Military Governor in Czechoslovakia, then served in the Korean War before being honorably discharged as a Captain.
